Brussels, 14-18 May 2018

In a nutshell:

What?

A 5-day professional skills training on fundraising and project management for academic and think-tank research, taking place at the heart of EU politics in Brussels. The training includes visits to European institutions, lectures and hands-on activities with think-tankers, academics, journalists, EU officials and professional trainers. By who?

The training is organised by the Trans European Policy Studies Association (TEPSA), the first network of research organisations in the field of European affairs (visit www.tepsa.eu).

For who?

- EU and non-EU young researchers with an interest in EU affairs/international relations/political science/law/social sciences.
- EU and non-EU students at postgraduate level interested in pursuing a career in research.

How to apply?

Send a CV and cover letter before **25 March 2018** to pont@tepsa.eu. The participation fee is €200 for applicants from TEPSA member organisations (current or former students/researchers) and €400 for other applicants. Travel and accommodation costs can be reimbursed up to €250.

In detail:

In the framework of the *Professional Training on EU Affairs – PONT* project, co-funded by the ERASMUS+/Jean Monnet Programme of the European Union, TEPSA is organising a 5-day intensive *Career Skills Training* at the heart of EU politics, in Brussels. It targets young researchers and students at postgraduate level with an interest in the EU sphere and pursuing a career in academic or policy research.

The training aims at introducing the participants to the Brussels arena, and developing skills related to policy-oriented research, research communication, fundraising and project management, which are not a part of most academic curricula, yet are vital for the employability of young researchers.



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The training maximizes individual feedback to participants and hands-on activities. It also offers participants an opportunity to establish useful contacts with academics, think-tankers and policymakers in Brussels.

In particular, the seminar participants will:

- Learn the methods of policy-oriented research and writing from professional think-tank researchers.
- Learn how to communicate one's research to policymakers and to the general public from high-level EU officials and professional journalists.
- Learn how to successfully design and implement a research project.
- Learn how to develop professional skills useful to pursue a career in a think tank or academia as well as to enhance their employability.

This training is organised by TEPSA and led by Prof. Hanna Ojanen, expert on European foreign, security and defence policy, who has ample experience in conducting professional skills trainings.

Non-EU citizens are also encouraged to apply. The deadline for applications is **25 March 2018**. Applicants will be informed about the decision of the selection committee on 30 March.

The participation fee for the total 5-day trainings is €200 for applicants currently or formerly enrolled/working in one of TEPSA's member institutes (the list of TEPSA member institutes can be found at www.tepsa.eu/members) and €400 for other applicants. This fee includes all training materials, access to all programme components and lunches during the training.

Participants can receive a reimbursement for their travel and accommodation costs for up to €250 upon presentation of original travel documents.

Participants will be asked to prepare a 2-page policy brief on a topic of their choice ahead of the training and full participation to all elements of the five-day programme is compulsory. Participants will receive a certificate of attendance after the completion of the training.
