Editorial:

With only two months delay from the original schedule, the European External Action Service (EEAS) has just been established. This delay is due essentially to the negotiations with the European Parliament (EP). The latter linked its consultative opinion on the service to the proposals on the needed adjustments of the Financial Regulation and the staff status, for which it possessed codecision power. This allowed the EP to check all the texts.

Actually the intervention of the EP has not led to major amendments on the status of the service. Its status remains independent from the Commission and the Council. The High Representative keeps complete authority over it and possesses authority over all agents i.e. central structures or delegations. Delegations could also be subject to instructions of the Commission in areas where the Commission exercises the powers conferred upon it by the Treaties, but under the condition that the High Representative ensures the consistency of the Union's external action.

The structure of the central services was at the heart of long debates. The EP refused that the High Representative could be represented by officials as part of her political responsibilities.

For this particular reason, the Secretary-General wears an 'executive' hat. The Executive is assisted by two Deputy Secretaries-General. Regarding the structure of the EEAS, it relies on the transfer of Council's and Commission's services which carried out responsibilities in CFSP and on the appointment of national officials. Eventually, the proportion of seconded national experts (SNEs) should account for at least 30 % of all EEAS staff and the proportion of the EU officials at least 60% of all EEAS staff.

One of the questions focused on the responsibility of the High Representative regarding the EU's instruments for external action. The compromise is close to the initial proposition (see article 9). The Commission is still in charge of the management of these instruments, but the High Representative takes part in the programming and notably prepares the Commission's decisions on, in this regard, multi-annual strategic measures.

During the EP vote at the Assembly, the High Representative put forward two declarations which are the main findings obtained by the EP: the first one covers the political accountability and sets up the relations between the High Representative and the Parliament, while the second one covers the organisation of the service.

The decision will be reviewed in 2013, almost two years after the implementation of the decision. Obviously TEPSA members will follow the first steps of the service carefully.

"Freedom, security and justice as a common challenge - justice and home affairs in the EU after the treaty of Lisbon"

THESEUS Seminar for young Leaders 2010 took place on 10-15 July 2010 in Brussels, at the Foundation Universitaire, rue d'Egmont 11, 1000 Brussels.

THESEUS is a common initiative of Centre d'études européennes de Sciences Po Paris, the Jean-Monnet-Chair for Political Science at the University of Cologne, the Trans European Policy Studies Association (Brussels) and the Fritz Thyssen Foundation (Cologne). Its aim is to establish a European network of thinkers, actors and ideas and to foster an open and constructive dialogue between members of the academic world and political actors about the future challenges of Europe. Emerging from a Franco-German initiative, THESEUS is striving to enhance the mutual understanding of societies in Europe.

This year, about 20 PhD students and young professionals from administration, research and business focused on the recent changes induced by the Lisbon Treaty with in the field of Justice and Home Affairs of the European Union.

Danish Institute for International Studies (DIIS) launches a series of debates on the EU's global role.

In recent years, much of the attention in the emerging field of EU external relations has concentrated on institutional and procedural matters. The entry into force of the Lisbon Treaty is hoped to herald a move towards what the EU aims to attain, and to be, on the world stage. The functioning of and prospects for EU external relations are also to relate more closely to actual areas of strategic relevance from both a thematic and geographical perspective, as well as to the foreign policies of individual EU member states—and especially Denmark, which will hold the EU rotating presidency in the first half of 2012.

DIIS launches *Lighthouse Europe*, a series of public debates on issues of strategic relevance for the foreign policy of the EU and of its member states. This series of public sessions, organized by DIIS in cooperation with the daily Politiken and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, attracts prominent speakers from the worlds of academia, public policy, diplomacy, business, and civil society to stimulate and generate debate on key issues of strategic foreign policy relevance for Europe, spanning broadly both in geographical and thematic terms.

The series was kicked off formally on Thursday 17th of June with a discussion featuring Dominique Moïsi, founder of the French Institute of International Relations, entitled *Culture of Fear: Challenging Europe's Global Role*.

New IIEA Report: Coalition in Britain Coalitions in Europe?

The formation of a coalition government by the Conservative Party and the Liberal Democrats coincides with a moment of deep crisis for the European Union. It does so by first analysing the compromises of the coalition deal and then placing these in the context of tensions that are likely to emerge in the UK-EU relationship over the next five years.
