## ***New Section: Introduction of a Member Institute***



### **Introducing DIIS – Danish Institute for International Studies**

DIIS is an independent research institution for international studies, financed primarily by the Danish state. We carry out research and analysis on a wide range of issues within the areas of globalisation, security and development. We participate in national and international debates and academic networks, and publish in high-ranking academic journals, always striving to excel in academic scholarship. At the same time, we assess Denmark's foreign and political situation and inform the Danish media, politicians and the public about our work.

We have approximately 100 employees comprising both research and support staff. We have different academic backgrounds, mostly in social studies, international development studies, military studies and anthropology.

Our research areas are defined on the basis of what we, as researchers, find to be current areas of special interest, and in relation to the surrounding societal and political context. We do basic research, research-based consultancies and commissioned work. Commissioned policy work is most often requested by the Danish Parliament, ministries, or other clients.

DIIS also has a special obligation to keep the memory of the Holocaust alive, and thus carries

out continual educational and informative work on this subject.

Currently, we are focusing on eight research areas:

- Defence and security
- Foreign policy and EU studies
- Global economy, regulation and development
- Holocaust and genocide
- Migration
- Natural resources and poverty
- Politics and governance
- The Middle East

The unit on Foreign Policy and EU studies is focusing on selected issues of EU external relations, such as EU enlargement and neighborhood, development, migration, the European Security and Defence Policy and EU-NATO relations. With the EU institutional architecture becoming operational after the Lisbon Treaty, the functioning of and prospects for EU external relations will also relate more closely to the foreign policies of individual EU member states—and especially Denmark, which will hold the EU rotating presidency in the first half of 2012. This summer DIIS launched “Lighthouse Europe” - a series of seminars focusing on the substance of EU foreign policy after the Lisbon Treaty.

#### EP Studies on Security and Defence

TEPSA has been successful to win a framework contract with the European Parliament's committee on external affairs in the areas on Security and Defence in earlier this year. Now, The European Parliament's Sub-committee on Security and Defence has contacted us for the elaboration and delivery of the four following studies under its Framework Contract with TEPSA:

- 1) The impact of the financial crises and the cuts in member states' defence budgets - how to spend better within the EU.
- 2) The role of security companies in CSDP missions and operations.
- 3) Cyber war and cyber security: challenges faced by the EU and its member states
- 4) Missile defence in Europe: the strategic and industrial impact

### News from TEPSA Member Institutes

#### Stockholm International Peace Research Institute



**Gunilla Herolf** has been elected Deputy Director (Andre Styresman) of the Royal Swedish Academy of War Sciences (Kungliga Krigsvetenskapsakademien).

She was previously the Chairman of Section VI, Security

Policy Studies. The Academy was founded in 1796. Today its most important tasks are to undertake studies, arrange lectures and seminars, publish its "Proceedings and Journal" and distribute rewards. She maintains her position a Senior Researcher at SIPRI.

### Cyprus Institute for Mediterranean, European and International Studies (KIMEDE)

In view of Professor Costas Melakopides's retirement from the University of Cyprus last August, KIMEDE has been contemplating its restructuring for some time. A probable development may be the "co-habitation" of KIMEDE with another Nicosia think-tank.

Last May, Professor Melakopides gave an invited lecture at the School of International Relations of the State University of St Petersburg. His paper was entitled, "Is Moscow's Policy towards Cyprus a Case of Pragmatic Idealism?". He also spoke, in Greek, at the School of Foreign Languages on current developments in the Cyprus problem.

Finally, Costas Melakopides represented KIMEDE in the Biennial Conference of the Directors of European Institutes of International Relations. Organised in Schengen, on October 1-2, by the Luxembourg Institute for European and International Studies (LIEIS), the conference addressed the question, "Is Europe's role in world affairs bound to decline?"


#### Prize :

The Institute of International Affairs (IIA) and Centre for Small State Studies (CSSS) at the

University of Iceland, in collaboration with the Swedish Institute of European Policy Studies (SIEPS) and the Finnish Institute of International Affairs (FIIA), held a successful conference on October 15<sup>th</sup> in the National Museum in Reykjavik, entitled 'Fifteen Years On: Finland and Sweden in the European Union'.

The conference was sponsored by both the Swedish and Finnish Embassies in Iceland, and it examined the respective countries' experiences of EU membership, in particular those areas important to Icelanders such as national identity in a European context, and the EU's monetary, agricultural and rural policies. The Icelandic respondents and audience critically examined if the success of the Finnish and Swedish EU stories could be repeated in an Icelandic context.



The conference was well attended, and the extensive media coverage of it demonstrates the will and need for many Icelanders to actively participate in the debates on Iceland's future. As Iceland is in the midst of the worst crisis in its modern history, the IIA/CSSS have been working hard to facilitate an open and informed debate on that future.

The conference was a part of this semester's seminar series 'the Europe Dialogues' organised by the IIA/CSSS every Friday - where researchers at the University of Iceland present their findings on European and Icelandic issues. Throughout the semester, the IIA/CSSS have also organised for guest speakers from other European universities, organisations and institutes to participate in 'the Europe Dialogues'.
