Ondřej Ditrych has been the Director of the Institute of International Relations since 2018. Jim Cloos is a high-ranking European official of longstanding esteem. Having taken on a key role in drafting the Maastricht Treaty during the Luxembourgish Presidency of the Council of the European Union in 1991, Mr. Cloos has an intricate expertise on EU Affairs and the internal functioning of the European institutions. In the 1990s he served at the European Commission, first as Head of the Cabinet of the Commissioner for Agriculture, and subsequently as Head of Cabinet to the President of the European Commission and his G7/8 Sherpa. Mr. Cloos has been a close collaborator of High Representative Javier Solana in shaping the EU's Common Foreign and Security Policy. For many years he played a key role in preparing European Council meetings. Before his election as TEPSA Secretary-General, he served as Deputy Director General for General and Institutional Policy at the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Union.

Petr Kratochvíl is a senior researcher at the Centre for European Politics. He studied Theology of Christian Traditions at the Protestant Theological Faculty of Charles University, International Relations at the Faculty of Social Sciences of Charles University, and International Political Sciences at the University of Economics in Prague. In 2011 he was appointed associate professor and in 2016 a full professor. In addition, he lectures at Sciences Po in Paris and at the Metropolitan University in Prague. He was also the Chairman of the Academic Council of the Diplomatic Academy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Czech Republic and the deputy director (2004-2013) and then director of IIR. He cooperates with a number of international academic institutions, most recently he held lectures at Sapienza, University of Rome, the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, or at University of Cambridge. As Director for the Unit in charge of preparing and coordinating the incoming Czech Presidency, Jakub Utěšený has a number of high-profile responsibilities to fulfil in advance of the new Presidency on July 1. During the next six months, the Czech Presidency will have to sail through troubled waters to address some of the most pressing EU issues, such as the Union's response to the ongoing war of aggression being waged by Russia in Ukraine, as well as managing multiple ongoing files, such as the implementation of the EU Green Deal, reacting to the conclusion of the Conference on the Future of Europe, and much more. As such, detailed preparations for this Presidency are of paramount importance, given the high stakes faced by Europe in the current moment. At the culmination of the Czech Pre-Presidency Conference, the speech by Jakub Utěšený will outline both his role in finalising the Czech government's plans for the next six months, and it will feature his reaction to the discussions that took place over the course of the Pre-Presidency Conference.
