Danijela Jaćimović, Professor at the Faculty of Economics, University of Montenegro, recently appeared on Dobro Jutro, the morning television programme on Radio I Televizija Crne Gore (RTCG), the Montenegrin public service broadcaster, to discuss the new book “Euroscepticism and the Future of Europe: Views from the Capitals” and the Faculty’s involvement in TEPSA as an Associate Member.

Along with PhD Candidate Sunčica Rogić, they authored the chapter on Euroscepticism in Montenegro: “A Great Bargain Between the European Union Optimism and Real Euroscepticism”. The chapter researched the impact of the 2019 European Parliament elections on domestic political parties’ programmes: through potential changes in public policies, and the rise of Eurosceptic arguments and rhetoric in Montenegro. In that context, and taking into account Montenegrin European Integration, the authors analysed the 2016-2020 political manifestos.

Eurosceptic parties are in government across Europe, and they have considerable influence over the national debate. “Euroscepticism and the Future of Europe: Views from the Capitals” maps and analyses this phenomenon across the continent. Over 40 authors have given their expert views on Euroscepticism in the EU, in neighbouring countries, and in candidate countries. “Euroscepticism and the Future of Europe: Views from the Capitals” is a political travel guide, taking you on a tour through the political diversity of Europe.
