On **20 October at 11:00**, TEPSA hosted an online TEPSA Debate on “**Euroscepticism and the Future of Europe: Views from the Capitals**”: our book edited by Michael Kaeding, Johannes Pollak and Paul Schmidt. You can now watch the full event here.

In the event we discussed and debate key questions on Euroscepticism and EU Affairs, including:

- What impact does Euroscepticism have on European politics and the future of Europe?
- How do Eurosceptic parties shape the political debate about the future of the Union?
- Has the COVID-19 crisis impacted how Eurosceptic parties that are in power govern?
- Has Euroscepticism lost or gained ground during the COVID-19 crisis?
