JEAN MONNET HOUSE A project of the European Parliament



It was in this thatched cottage that Jean Monnet discussed the future of Europe with the most senior politicians of the time. Here, in the final days of April 1950, that he and his associates wrote Robert Schuman's historic declaration. Addressing Europe on 9 May, the Minister for Foreign Affairs proposed the creation of the European Coal and Steel Community (ESCA), which laid the foundations for the first European Community. It is an ideal place to learn about the history of European integration and about the life and work of one of the architects of today's Europe.
